Sustainable Southbury Partners with EyeRecycle for a Popup Bottle and Can Redemption Event Sunday, April 30th, 12 - 3 pm 800 Main Street South, Southbury, CT

Earn cash back for your recycled bottles, and cans — all from the comfort of your car! No sign-up is required for this or future Popup events.

EyeRecycle offers recycling for redeemable plastic and aluminum cans. There's no waiting in line to put the containers through a machine. You simply drop off your bag of redeemable bottles and cans at the EyeRecycle truck.



Collect your redeemable plastic and glass bottles and cans and place them in a large bag. Not sure if it is redeemable? (Look near the barcode or recycle symbol to find the label that says CT 0.05 Cent REFUND.) Please place glass in your own small cardboard box or a 6, 12, 18, or 24-pack cardboard carrier (they cannot accept loose glass bottles). No wine or liquor bottles (they are not redeemable).

EyeRecycle will transfer your bottles/cans into their EyeRecycle bag that has a fill line so they know how much to pay you. A full EyeRecycle bag earns \$10 cash back and individual items earn \$0.05 per item.

We have expanded our Business Waste Reduction Program

Sustainable Southbury is excited to announce we have partnered with the Center for EcoTechnology, Eve Recycle, Aradia Farms, Curbside Compost, and ELC Energy Solutions to offer a suite of waste reduction services to businesses. Most services are free of charge. The **Center for EcoTechnology** provides free, customized recommendations, implementation assistance, and continued free support for reducing wasted food,



general waste reduction, and recycling assistance. **Aradia Farms and Curbside Compost** pick up whatever wasted food scraps are leftover. **EyeRecycle** picks up redeemable bottles and cans for free and splits the 5-cent redemption with the business. **ELC Energy Solutions** provides free energy audits and helps with financial Incentives, lighting, refrigeration energy efficiency upgrades, HVAC system improvements, and solar power and EV charger installations. **Sustainable Southbury** helps businesses make planet-friendly choices including reusable cups, recycled materials, single-use plastic reduction, and eco-friendly plastic alternatives.

COMING IN JULY TO THE SOUTHBURY TRANSFER STATION

A big thank you to everyone who helped us with our community fundraiser! We exceeded our goal amount by receiving donations from 83 individuals and businesses - achieving a full dollar-for-dollar matching from Sustainable CT. With these funds and grants from the Rotary, New England Grass Roots Fund, and Community Foundation we are busy creating wasted food reduction programs for residents and businesses.

We are excited to report that we are working with First Selectman Jeff Manville, Director of Public Works Blake Leonard, and Finance Director Dan Colton on setting up a town-wide Food Scrap Recycling pilot program at our Town Transfer station. All Southbury residents can drop off their food scrap waste at the transfer station during business hours, free of charge.

To make the collection of food scraps easier for residents, kits of countertop and storage/transportation bins will be available at cost for any Southbury resident.

Our start date is July 1, 2023, so be on the lookout for outreach events and the sale of containers. Signage and educational materials will be available on the Town and Sustainable Southbury's website and at the transfer station.

Stay tuned for more updates and come join us in any capacity you can! We need volunteers to help educate our residents on this program. No prior training is necessary - we will provide everything needed.

Sustainable Southbury Forms a New Energy Subcommittee



Our new energy subcommittee is forming partnerships with the Town of Southbury, Peoples Action for Clean Energy (PACE), and SmartPower, to get the word out about energy efficiency improvements we can all do to save money and help the environment. We are organizing a community energy campaign to help people learn more about energy conservation, heat pump installations, battery storage, and solar installations, and to find financial incentives to help pay for it.

For example, did you know that the Eversource Home Energy Solutions Program (HES) provides Energy Efficiency audits that provide tailored recommendations and corresponding rebates and incentives and result in \$350 average annual energy savings? The audits are \$50 or free to those that qualify and include numerous rebates and financial incentives for energy-efficiency upgrades.
